Outcomes

Short Term

Expansion of hub network

Increased victim and offender satisfaction with outcomes

Increased inter-organizational collaboration

Reduced number of suspensions

Increased contact with court involved youth

Intermediate

School Improvements (increased attendance, GPA, graduation rates, etc.)

Reduced incarceration rates

Decreased recidivism

Intergenerational connectedness

Increased court compliance

Improved relations with schools, police, and service providers

Long Term

Restorative justice practices become the norm

Juvenile detention facilities become obsolete

Communities become safer

Decreased violence (shootings and homicides)

Decriminalization of communities

Improvement in quality of life for youth (education, employment, engagement, etc.)

Increased peer support and life expectations
